

Course Comments

General structure:

Program/Major Code ONLY

The word ONLY indicates that this particular course section is restricted to students in the major code identified.

Program/Major Code (Number)

The comment indicates that this section of the course has reserved seats for students in the program codes listed and the number in parenthesis indicates the number of seats reserved for those students. Course reserves are monitored from March until August and may be lifted for the non-program students. If the comment no longer appears on the course, the course reserve has been lifted and is open for all students.

Specific Comments:

Alt Wks

The course is scheduled for every other week. That is, you would attend the course on Week 1, then Week 3, then Week 5, etc.

Alternate Weeks – X when off campus

The course is scheduled on alternating weeks to be at the location specified in the X position.

Art

The course is currently reserved for students in the Bachelor of Fine Art, Visual Art and Bachelor of Education with a major in Art programs.

BADM

The course is currently reserved for students in the Business Administration program which includes majors in Accounting, General and Marketing as well as students in the Management Certificate program which includes Skywings Aviation students as well as the Financial Services program. Course reserves are monitored from March until August and may be lifted for the non-program students. If the comment no longer appears on the course, the course reserve has been lifted and is open for all students.

BEd

The course is only offered every third week.

Fall Math 202 Continued - Permission Needed

This is a seminar for students that were not successful in Math 202 in the Fall term to take. If the student is successful there will be a pass applied to the fall term. IF the student is unsuccessful, the fail will be applied to the fall term.

Final approval subject to audition during first class or date is listed

Approval for registration into this course depends on the approval of your audition. The audition takes place during the first class or on the date indicated in the comment. If you are approved, you remain registered in the course. If you are not approved, you must drop the course.

Flat fee will be charged

This indicates that there are no billing credits attached to the course; rather, a flat charge will be calculated upon registration into the course.

Hunting Hills Only

This is restricted to students taking Business Administration courses at Hunting Hills High School.

Includes a week camp X Date to X Date

This course includes a week long camp in the dates listed in the course comment. This camp is a requirement for the course.

Independent Study

Independent study refers to work completed in individual computer module courses. Students may register themselves into a different course seminar that will contain some information for their particular module of study.

KNSS

The comment indicates that this section of the course is reserved for students in the Kinesiology and Sport Studies program which includes General, Adapted Physical Education, Coaching and Sport Performance, Fitness and Health Promotion, and Sport Management. Course reserves are monitored from March until August and may be lifted for the non-program students. Lakewood Golf Course when Offcampus

The course is not in a regular classroom; it is taught at the Lakewood Golf Course when off campus.

Live Class virtually (using Blackboard Collaborate)

This is a webinar method using Blackboard Collaborate. The instructor and students access a program, Collaborate, to screen share, video share, web share, chat, webcam, view power points, interact with the whiteboard.

Math 31 > 70%

A high school grade of 70% or higher in Math 31 is required before registration into this course.

Math 30-2 accepted as a pre-requisite

Successful completion of Math 30-2 is required before registration into this course. You will be dropped if you do not have this pre-requisite.

Minimum XX (number) students required

The course requires a minimum number of students in order to run. If the number is not met, the course may be cancelled.

Must pass music entrance exam

This course requires a successful pass of the Music Entrance exam.

Must register in person due XX

Student must register at the Registrar's Office due to conditions specified in the XX statement.

Must take section AA, BB, CC, etc in Winter term or Must have taken section A, B, C, etc in Fall term

This comment will be attached to all Full Year Courses (two terms back to back). It means when you register in the Fall section A (or B or C, etc), you must ensure that you also register in the corresponding Winter section AA (or BB or CC, etc). Or, if you register in the Winter section AA (or BB or CC, etc), you must ensure that you have completed the Fall section of the corresponding course.

Must take Lecture/Section X, Seminar # or Lab # (e.g. Must take section A, Must take seminar 52, must take lab 01)

Lectures, labs and seminars are connected and you must enroll in a particular combination of a lecture, lab and seminar if this comment is indicated. Comments included with the lecture will tell you which lab you need to register in and/or comments with the lab will tell you which lecture you need to register in, etc.

MUST Register with Advisor

Registration must be approved by an Academic Advisor in person; this course is not available for web registration.

Must register with UofC Office

The course is only available to University of Calgary students. If you are a UofC student, you must register in person with the UofC office on campus.

Online

Self-Directed

The course materials are all-inclusive; i.e. a student can work through the material without extra input by an instructor but a mandatory seminar is required to provide the student with support.

X Cohort Only

The X indicates a specific group of students that this course is offered for.

XX (number) unscheduled lab hours

You will be required to arrange and participate in additional course lab hours that are not scheduled for you.
